November 2025 Board Highlights

Division One, Viticulture, Enology, and the Southwest Wine Center

On October 25th, 2025, Wine & Dine "Under the Stars"—an annual fundraising event hosted by the Yavapai College Foundation and the Friends of the Southwest Wine Center (FoSWC) in support of the Viticulture and Enology (VEN) Program at Yavapai College's Verde Valley Campus—was an enormous success, raising \$88,000 for the program. This sets a new record, exceeding prior years by nearly \$30,000. Proceeds from the event help fund Endowed scholarships for VEN students, student activities and experiential learning opportunities, and priority needs of the VEN Program. Each year, guests enjoy an evening of fine food and wine, featuring local wineries and restaurants—many of which include Southwest Wine Center alumni. Funds are raised through a combination of sponsorships, ticket sales, auctions, and other engaging activities.











The Southwest Wine Center successfully hosted five performances over three days in mid-October of The Concert Truck, in conjunction with the Yavapai College Performing Arts Center. Attendance collectively topped 100 community members, many of whom were first-time visitors to the SWC.



In partnership with Sedona TV, the Southwest Wine Center has produced a new video segment currently airing in numerous Sedona hotels and motels. This year-long promotional campaign highlights both the educational (enrollment) side of our programs and the Tasting Room experience.

The content will also be repurposed for additional marketing avenues to be announced soon.

The Southwest Wine Center was nominated for the 1st Annual Sedona Innovation Award, presented by the Sedona Chamber of Commerce, recognizing our leadership in education in the Verde Valley.

Beginning in November, the Southwest Wine Center is featured in the 3rd edition of Edible Central Arizona (Nov–Jan issue)—the start of a year-long marketing campaign reaching Central and Northern Arizona's food and wine enthusiasts. This issue's Holiday Gift Guide includes a QR code allowing readers to directly join (and pay for) either the Fall or Fall & Spring Wine Club releases. This marks a new, proactive way of connecting with potential members in the coming months.

Viticulture

Following harvest, Vineyard Manager Jeremiah Prough, students, and staff have focused on irrigation upgrades and precision improvements. New systems now allow better isolation of individual rows and blocks, and previous issues—such as single-row misfires—have been corrected. The APS grant awarded earlier this fall has been activated to fund two soil sensor monitors, each reading five depths simultaneously. These serve as excellent teaching tools for students while advancing the vineyard's long-term commitment to water stewardship and reduced consumption year-over-year.

Camp Verde Library Open House - October 21, 2025

Yavapai College's Skilled Trades Center, Horticulture, and Viticulture & Enology programs participated in the Camp Verde Library Open House on October 21st, 2025. This was our first Open House in Camp Verde, meeting a direct request from the Town of Camp Verde to bring educational outreach and program awareness to their community.

Instructors from across our hands-on programs—including HVAC, Residential Electric, Carpentry, Plumbing, and Viticulture & Enology—were on site to share information, answer questions, and connect with community members interested in pursuing technical education and career pathways. The event provided a great opportunity to highlight the diverse training opportunities available through Yavapai College and to inspire future students to explore rewarding careers in the skilled trades and wine industries.







Division Two, Administration of Justice Studies

YC Students Engage in Powerful Learning at Justice Institute Summits

Last week, the Yavapai College Justice Institute hosted two impactful events that brought students and professionals together for hands-on learning, leadership development, and real-world insight into community safety and care.


Example 1 Leadership Summit: Performance Driven Thinking & Actively Caring for People – Thursday, October 30



Division Three, Visual, Performing, Film and Media Arts

• The Prescott Art Gallery celebrated October with four different public events related to the recent exhibition, Transforming Traditions: Art and Folklore in 2025. A highlight of the series was exhibition juror and Humanities Professor Dr. Suzanne Waldenberger's lecture on the Folklore of Halloween. The monthlong folklore celebration also featured a lecture and performance by local folk musician Mark Matos, and a poetry workshop and readings in the gallery. On November 14, the YC Prescott Art Gallery presents the 2025 Fall Juried Student Exhibition, which features 65 works of art by YC student-artists.



• The Patty McMullen-Mikles Art Gallery will feature the Fall Student Art Exhibition for Verde Valley students from November 13 to December 4. This semi-annual showcase highlights creative works from students in ceramics, drawing, and painting. The opening reception, held from 5 to 7 p.m., will include offerings from the Southwest Wine Center and complimentary small bites as students, families, and faculty come together to celebrate the semester's artistic accomplishments.



• The Sedona Center will present *Cloud Cover*, a solo exhibition by artist and Fine Arts Professor **Ben Norton**, on view from October 8 to December 18, 2025. The exhibition explores vision and perception through paintings and pastels that capture the interplay of light, form, and color across Arizona's landscapes, where moments of wilderness and human presence blend in unexpected harmony. • OLLI's Fall 2 session is off with a bang – with everything from Prescott History to the Geology of Jerome, from galaxies to art to wellness.







- OLLI Gives Back! OLLI collected 14 Sets of hear aids that can be refurbished to assist those in need.


