
March 2024 Board Highlights

Academic Division One – Career and Technical Education – CTEC

Students in the spring air traffic control (ATC) class began to use the new system software in the lab which was updated over Winter break by IT personnel and the parent software company, Meta Craft. Instructor Ed Fisher indicated that "The new software, communications, and display systems for the lab are really incredible." With updated graphics, exercises, clarity, display screens, communication systems, and tower control simulations, the lab is one of the most state-of-the-art ATC training labs in the nation. Students take classes in air traffic control in preparation for entrance exams into the FAA Air Control school in Oklahoma. There is currently a shortage of air traffic controllers in the United States, where annual salaries average over \$115,000.











Academic Division 1 – Chino Valley Center

 Horticulture students (AGS252) are actively propagating plants for the end of the year student plant sale in May. There are weekly plantings that teach different ideas and techniques for student learning. The 13th annual sale is at the Chino Valley Center Saturday, May 11th starting at 8am.



Viticulture and Enology

 The Viticulture and Enology (VEN) program took ten students to the Unified Wine and Grape Symposium. The trip was a success and exposed the students to emerging technologies. The speakers at the symposium shared market trends on sales and demographic changes in the industry. The side trip to the NovaVine Nursery was one of the highlights. The students learned about vine propagation and disease control.









- The VEN program purchased six new pH meters for the spring quality control and analysis course. These will replace meters that are over ten years old. The students will use them for the wine camp weekend from May 3rd through 5th.
- The tasting room continues expanding "Wine Experiences" for the spring semester. Lisa Aguilar leads these expanded educational offerings catered to small groups. - A craft distilling license is now in place at the Southwest Wine Center (SWC.) This new license allows students to distill and bottle craft spirits for sale, broadening our curriculum and product offerings. They are working to finalize the packaging design and plan to have a product available for purchase in early summer.
- Final pruning of the vineyard is underway, with timing planned to coincide with bud break. Historically, bud break happens around spring break. So far, the winter session has provided above-average precipitation.


