Associate degrees in nursing earned from accredited institutions will fulfill the same Yavapai College General Education requirements (up to 28 credits) to earn a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (RN-BSN) degree. AAS Nursing requirements are met by Prior Learning Assessment for RN nursing degree and license (40.5 credit sequence of nursing theory, skills, and clinical courses).

Students who successfully complete LDR 201, LDR 202, and LDR 203 earn a Management - Strategic Leadership Certificate
