<u>A Note from the Associate Dean of</u> <u>Nursing</u>

Welcome nursing students to the SPRING 2025 semester. Currently, there are approximately 233 students enrolled in the nursing program at the Prescott and Verde Valley locations, including a new cohort of 62 first-semester students! This is a 24% increase from previous semesters, thanks to a Nursing Education Investment grant (HB2691).

Our RN-BSN program is well underway. We had 18 graduates in December from the Spring 24 cohort. Congratulations. We submitted our self-study report on January 28, 2025, and continue to prepare for the site visit scheduled for March 11-13, 2025. Official approval will be determined by Fall 2025. Once approved, our accreditation status is backdated to the time of our eligibility/ candidacy was accepted which was November 16, 2023. As a result, any graduate from the RN-BSN program will have graduated from an accredited program.

This RN-BSN is post-licensure, meaning applicants must possess an unencumbered RN license to apply and have graduated from an accredited nursing program. All YC nursing graduates will be automatically accepted into the program pending licensure verification. Cost for the RN-BSN program is \$8,845 for 30.5 credits @ \$290/credit (24/25 tuition/fees).

The LPN-RN advance placement option is going well. We had two students enrolled into the third semester in Spring 2025.

The nursing program collaborated with Allied Health to offer an LPN step-out option for nursing students completing year one of the program. The step-out option will begin Spring 2025. This course allows students to seek their LPN license and enter the workforce to earn a more livable wage.

Yavapai College (YC) Nursing graduates continue to be successful on the NCLEX-RN Licensure with a first-time pass rate of 94.51% for 2024. These rates remain comparable to the 93.75% pass rate for the state of Arizona and the 91.16% pass rate nationally.

Our program completion rate for 2023-2024 was 77.6%.

Currently, according to the Arizona Board of Nursing, there are 114,595 RN's practicing in Arizona (www.azbn.gov). An increased demand for RNs in Arizona's future estimates 28,000 more needed by 2025* (AZBN Newsletter, Nov 2022). Job Placement Rates for YC nursing graduates in 2024* year-to-date is 97% with an 87% response rate.

As of January 2025, Yavapai College is still ranked 11th out of 33 nursing schools across Arizona^{**}, according <u>Registered Nursing.org</u>. This ranking is up from 12th in 2023 and based on current and historical NCLEX pass rates.

Student assistance is always required to ensure we have the most accurate data. Be sure to look for postgraduate surveys and respond promptly.

The <u>Nursing Program Student Handbook</u> for 2024-2025 was revised on 01/17/2025. While midacademic year changes are rare, a few policy changes were made that go into effect immediately. Here is a summary of the changes:

- 1. Academic Dishonesty (cheating) was added to the Zero Tolerance policy
- 2. Revised grading scale to affirm the no rounding rule for grades: i.e. C = 78.00-83.99%
- 3. Added chain of communication overview
- 4. Updated attendance policy #2 to clarify that attendance is expected during the entire class; combined expectations for theory and skills lab; any missed skill/dosage calc will result in a zero grade
- 5. Updated exam policy #3 to clarify all SATA/Alt format questions will have + / grading as appropriate to match NCLEX scoring, no more collaborative exams, clarified consequences of not uploading ExamSoft exams in a timely fashion
- 6. Updated medication administration policy #6 to clarify that dosage calculation competency should be completed by week 3; if not, the student will receive a "D" grade on their midterm evaluation
- 7. Updated readmission policy #7 to clarify that readmission skills must be completed prior to attending hospital orientation
- 8. Professional conduct policy #10 was updated to clarify unprofessional behavior and consequences of academic dishonesty, and clarified that students cannot complete clinical at a facility in which they are employed

Students are responsible each semester for knowing and following the contents of the most current Nursing Program Student Handbook and reviewing all YC communications or emails from nursing@yc.edu for important program announcements and policy updates.

REMINDER: Students can register for nursing classes as soon as registration opens. This will enable students to self-schedule their courses and select their clinical placements. There are several disclaimers to this process:

- 1. Students who start in the evening cohort will always have first priority to register for the evening courses/clinical. Students who want to move from evening to days or days to evening must schedule an appointment with the Nursing Director to ensure program availability.
- 2. Students must attend class/clinical on the campus they were accepted to. For example, a student living in Prescott Valley, who accepted program placement on the Verde campus, must attend clinicals in Verde.
- 3. Please pay attention to which course/campus you are registering for. Several students registered for classes on the incorrect campus.
- 4. When registering for clinical, students must select a clinical site different from where they work. For example, if a student works at the VA, they must select YRMC; if a student works at YRMC EAST, then they must select WEST or the VA as their clinical site.

Clinical Updates:

Health requirements are to be current throughout the entire semester. Students must meet all clinical compliance requirements by established due dates to be eligible to proceed into the clinical setting. Students who do not comply risk being administratively withdrawn from the clinical setting by the Nursing Director.

There are **two clinical tracking systems** used in the nursing program. CastleBranch is a clinical tracking system that is used by the YC Nursing Program to ensure students are up to date on their clinical requirements. CastleBranch is first implemented upon admission to the program for students to purchase their background checks, drug screens, and the clinical health requirement checklist and must be maintained throughout the course of the nursing program.

My Clinical Exchange is used by the clinical agencies for 2nd, 3rd, and 4th-semester clinical requirements. Students must complete the required hospital onboarding modules in MyCE before orientation at the clinical site. Both sites must be maintained while in the nursing program.
