

Nursing Pre-Entry Requirements Total Credits: 34-37 Progression Plan

Note: Pre-entry requirements must be complete, or in progress, in order to apply to the Nursing Program. To prepare to apply to the AAS Nursing Program, it is recommended that students begin in the Associate of Arts (Nursing Intent) degree program and work closely with an academic advisor to ensure timely and on-track progression for application submission.

The 28 credit hour pre-entry block includes Anatomy & Physiology I & II, Microbiology, and all of the General Education requirements.

• Prior to program application, the applicant must be certified as a CNA, LNA or have completed AHS 114, AHS 114C, and AHS 114L (or equivalent) within the last three years.
